Module Descriptor

Purpose: The purpose of this module is to equip the learner with the relevant knowledge, skill and competence to blow dry hair, using a hand dryer, under supervision.

Module Duration: The learning effort required from a typical learner to successfully achieve the stated learning outcomes for the module is **50** (**fifty**) hours.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of this module, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Identify the tools required to blow dry a client's hair to a given style using a variety of methods
- 2. Identify the consumables and equipment required to blow dry a client's hair using a hand dryer
- 3. Describe the steps to be followed when blow drying hair to a client's requirements to include application of styling products
- 4. Set up a work station and trolley with all the appropriate tools and consumables to blow dry and finish a hair style to a client's requirements
- 5. Communicate effectively with a client on a preferred hair style and styling requirements
- 6. Use sectioning techniques to section hair correctly for blow drying
- 7. Blow dry a client's hair using a hand dryer while following correct procedures of salon quality standards, including the application of blow dry products to suit the hair type
- 8. Operate all styling equipment to complete a blow dry while following correct industry safety and quality standards, including the application of hair protectors
- 9. Style hair to a client's requirements, including the application of styling and finishing products to suit hair type
- 10. Operate safely and effectively in a salon environment
- 11. Maintain acceptable standards of salon and personal hygiene when working in a salon environment

- Organising a trolley and appropriate tools for blow drying

- Quality of finished style

Activities:

Generic Skills: Literacy and Numeracy

The learners will keep and maintain a **Learning Diary** throughout the course in order to record and file any useful and relevant information on blow drying, hand dryers, various types and sizes of brushes for blow drying (vent, denman, round brushes, etc.), styling products, finishing products, hair straighteners, curling tongs and hair protection products.

At the end of every week, the learners will complete a short **Weekly Reflective Sheet** in order to reflect on their learning and progress during that week.

This Weekly Reflective Sheet will assist the learners to develop their generic skills of literacy, numeracy, communications and quality awareness and will give learners an opportunity to develop their writing skills.

The learners will create a **Personal Dictionary** of new words, key words and terms relating to blow drying, hand dryers, various types and sizes of brushes for blow drying (vent, denman, round brushes, etc.), styling products, finishing products, hair straighteners, curling tongs and hair protection products.







This Dictionary will be updated each week and kept in the Learning Diary.

As a group, the learners will add words and terms to a **Key Word and Terminology Bank** in the classroom relating to blow drying, hand dryers, various types and sizes of brushes for blow drying (vent, denman, round brushes etc), styling products, finishing products, hair straighteners, curling tongs and hair protection products.

The learners will find words listed in text books, class notes, manufacturers' product information and websites.

The learners will complete a number of **Word Search/Quizzes**. These are **Word Search 1; Word Search 2; Word Search 3**. When they have gained sufficient practice and experience at these, each learner will make up one (1) Word Search/Quiz, which will be completed by the group.

When the learners have completed certain activities/exercises, they will complete a **True or False** Quiz for that particular activity/exercise. These are: **quiz No1 for LO6 and L013**; **quiz No2 for LO9 and L011**. There should be at least two (2) days between the completion of the activity/exercise and the completion of the quiz.

Generic Skill: Science Literacy

Each Learner will watch a video/DVD on **Human Hair**. Using a text book and class notes the learner will draw a cross section of the human hair and will show and name the 3 (three) parts of a hair. The learner will write or type a short description of the 3 (three) parts of a hair.

The drawing and description will be kept in the Learning Diary.

The learners will make a large drawing of a Human Hair on a flip chart. The 3 (three) parts of the hair will be shown on the drawing and the drawing will be displayed in the classroom/salon.

Each learner will research into the **hair protection products** that are now available to protect the hair when hair straighteners or curling tongs are being used. The information will include:

- The chemical ingredients
- Why the products should be used
- What the products do
- Whether the products achieve their intended results
- How they achieve their results

The learners will write or type a short account of their findings. This account will be kept in the Learning Diary.







When the learners have gathered the information, they will discuss their findings with the rest of the group. A group discussion will take place on the merits or otherwise of these products.

If the group wishes, one member of the group will be nominated as Recorder and will write or type a short report for the group on the group findings.

A copy of this report will be kept in the Learning Diary of each learner.

Generic Skill: Literacy and Teamwork

The learners will work in teams of two (2). Each team will gather information on the history of blow drying using a variety of methods – class notes, text book, manufacturers' representatives and product information, local library, the Internet, etc. The information gathered should include:

- When hairdressers started to use blow drying on a regular basis
- Why hairdressers started to use blow drying
- Who is thought to have popularised blow drying
- When it became popular
- Why it became popular
- How fashions have changed over the years because of blow drying

Each team will write a report of **not more than 200 (two hundred) words** about their findings and present their findings to the group.

Each team will photocopy or cut out from magazines a number of photographs of blow dry styles from the 1950s, 1960s, 1970s, 1980s, 1990s and 2000s, in order to illustrate their report on how blow drying styles and methods have developed and advanced.

This report and the photographs will be kept in the Learning Diary.

Each team will research into the development of hair straighteners and curling tongs, commencing with the invention of the Marcel curling tongs. Each group will write or type a short account of their findings.

A copy of this report will be kept in the Learning Diary.

Generic Skill: Teamwork

The learners will work in teams of two (2). Using a hard-backed A4 sized notebook, each team will make a Consumables Stock Book/Record for the different mousses, gels, hair protection products and finishing products being used in the salon. This record will show:

The present level of each product







- The desired level of each product
- The amount of each product needed to be ordered

When completed, each team will make a presentation of their record.

When the presentations have been completed, this record will be added to the Consumable Stock Book/Record the group will have already created, and it will be used as a Stock Record.

This Stock Book/Record will continue to be used to record the level of all consumable salon products throughout the course.

Note: Each week a different team will be complete a consumables stock check of the mousses, gels, hair protection products and finishing products in the store room. The instructor will be informed on a weekly basis as to the level of mousses, gels, hair protection products and finishing products held in the salon, in case a requisition needs to be submitted to stores

Generic Skill: Numeracy: Digital

Learners will practice **using a calculator**, identifying and locating all keys needed to carry out basic calculations

<u>Generic Skill: Communications; Literacy (Verbal)</u> Role Play:

The learners will work in teams of two (2). One (1) will take the **role of a stylist**, and the other will take the role of a client. Each team will practise the following scenarios:

A new client wishes to have her hair blow dried.

The stylist will discuss the client's requirements, make some suggestions, advise the client and show the client photographs of some suggested styles.

 A regular client, who normally has her hair roller set but has never had her hair blow dried, wishes to have a complete change of style.

The stylist will show the client some photographs of blow dry styles, discuss the client's requirements and advise the client.

The roles can then be reversed.

Practical:







Prior to working on 'live' models the learners will **practise various blow dry styles and dressing out** (Practical Exercise 1) mannequin heads until proficient. The learners will complete the following blow drying exercise using a variety of methods. They will dry a mannequin head:

- Using various round brushes
- Using a Vent brush
- Using a Denman Brush
- Using a Diffuser
- By Finger Drying
- By Scrunch Drying

The learners will write or type a short account, of not more than 200 (two hundred) words, comparing each type of blow dry. They will include information on:

- Safety aspects of each type of method
- Ease of styling using each type of method
- Strength of style result
- Difference of style result
- When each type of blow dry method would be most suitable

This account will be kept in the Learning Diary.

The learners will discuss their findings as a group. If the group wishes, one member of the group will write or type a report of the discussion. A copy of this report will be kept in each learner's Learning Diary.

Prior to working on clients, the learners can **practise blow drying and finishing** each others' hair (Practical. Exercise 2)

These exercises will be ongoing (Practical Exercise 3) and will be used so that the learners can become proficient at gowning, shampooing, conditioning, combing and detangling a client's hair without pulling the hair or hurting the client, applying mousse or styling products, blow drying using a variety of methods and/or brushes, styling and finishing a blow dry.

The learners will **practise using hair straighteners and curling tongs on mannequin heads** and applying hair protection products before using these appliances.
